- 4.1.3 **Reservation for Persons with Disabilities:** Leaving the seats set apart under Clauses 4.1.1, 4.1.2 above, all types of supernumerary seats sanctioned, five percent of the seats available for the state for allotment from the Entrance rank lists for all the courses in all the Government Colleges, Aided colleges and Government Cost-sharing Engineering Colleges are reserved for the candidates with Benchmark disabilities. [For details, refer Clause 5.3]
- 4.1.4 **Special Reservation:** These are the seats reserved for certain specific categories, for different courses. [For details, refer Clause 5.2]
- 4.1.5 **Mandatory Reservation:** Leaving the seats set apart for All India Quota, Government of India Nominees, Special reservations, Persons with Disabilities, all types of supernumerary seats sanctioned and Management Quota, the remaining Government seats for each course in Govt./Aided/KAU/KVASU/KUFOS Colleges will be distributed as per the mandatory reservation principle as contemplated in G.O. (P) No.208/66/Edn. Dated 2.5.1966, G.O.(Ms)No.95/08/SCSTDD Dated 06.10.2008, GO(Ms) No. 10/2014/BCDD Dated 23.05.2014, G.O. (Ms) No.128/2020/HEdn. Dated 20.03.2020, and as modified from time to time.

entertained under any circumstance and such seats will be merged to the Mandatory reservation quota.


(vii) Seats under Special Reservation in Self-financing colleges, if available, will be notified separately. Such seats, if any, will not be shifted to Government/Aided colleges under any circumstance. The details of Special Reservation seats earmarked in Govt./Aided Colleges are given in **Annexure II (2) (a), III (2), IV (2), V (2), VI (3) (a) and VII (4)**.

5.2.1 **Ex-servicemen Quota (XS):** Applicants to this category should invariably upload to the online application, a certificate in **Annexure XIII (a)(i) or (a) (ii)** as applicable obtained **not earlier than six months** from the last date of application from the Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer concerned to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter of ex-serviceman or an ex-serviceman himself/herself. The certificate should clearly show that the benefit of reservation has not been granted earlier to any member in the family. In the absence of the certificate, the claim will not be considered.

5.2.2 **Dependent of Defence Personnel Killed / Missing / Disabled in action (DK):** This benefit will be available to one person only from the family concerned in respect of each defence person killed in action/missing in action/disabled either during war hostilities or in peace time circumstances of which are identical to activities during operational engagements. They should invariably upload a certificate in **Annexure XIII(a)(iii)** to the online application obtained **not earlier than six months** from the last date of application from the Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer concerned to the effect that he/she is the son/daughter/widow of the defence person who was killed in action or missing in action or disabled in action. In the case of disabled personnel, the certificate should specify that the concerned person was/is in receipt of disability pension. The certificate should clearly show that the benefit of reservation has not been granted earlier to any member in the family. In the absence of the certificate, the claim will not be considered.

If no suitable candidate under DK category is available for the concession, as per the existing order/rules, the seats reserved for them will be given to the son/daughter/widow of the defence personnel who died in harness (HR), if they are otherwise eligible as per Clause 6. They should upload a certificate in Annexure XIII (a) (iv) to the online application obtained not earlier than six months from the last date of application from Military Authority/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that the defence personnel had died while in service. The certificate should clearly show that the benefit of reservation has not been granted earlier to any member in the family. In the absence of the certificate, the claim will not be considered.

If there are still no suitable candidates under HR category, the seats reserved for the children/widow of defence personnel killed in action/missing in action/disabled will be given to children of Serving Defence personnel or in their absence to ex-servicemen/children of ex-servicemen.

6 CENTRALISED ALLOTMENT(SWS)

The allotment to respective colleges/courses/branches is through a Single Window Centralized Allotment Process based on the options filed by the candidate online. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE), Kerala will prepare the rank list and conduct the online allotment process.

7 RESERVATION OF SEATS

7.1 M.Pharm

7.1.1 Service Quota

One seat is reserved in College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram for B. Pharm Degree holders in the Drugs Control department. In the absence of qualified hands from the Drugs Control department, this seat will be filled among the staff (Technicians and Pharmacists on rotation basis) of Directorate of Medical Education and Directorate of Health Services on rotation basis. In the absence of qualified persons from Medical Education Services and Health Services Department, the seat will be filled by B. Pharm holders from Employees State Insurance Department. For the academic year 2022, this seat is reserved in the subject Pharmacy Practice.

7.1.2 Community Reservation

Community reservation (distributed equally among all the subjects) is as follows:-

7.1.3 Reservation for Physically Disabled (PD)- (See the annexure-XX)

Five percent (5%) of the total seats are reserved for Physically Disabled (PD) candidates. The eligibility criteria are as follows:

Seats reserved for candidates with Benchmark Disabilities as stipulated in Section 32, Chapter VI of the Persons with Disabilities act-2016. As per Clause 2 (r) Chapter 1 of the Act, "Persons with Benchmark Disability" means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a Persons with Disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. Generally, Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible to apply this quota.

: For claiming reservation under PwD category, the certificate of disability from the District Medical Board certifying the percentage of degree of disability has to be produced before the State Medical Board at the time of medical verification.

The certificate of disability from the District Medical Board must be produced at the time of medical verification. No document/certificate is to be uploaded to the online application.

: The State Medical Board constituted by the Government under the Chairmanship of DME consisting of Medical Experts in General Medicine, ENT, Neurology, Orthopaedic Surgery, Ophthalmology, Psychiatry and Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, will examine the

degree of Physical disability of the candidates who are provisionally included in this category. The State Medical Board will have powers to review the certificate issued by the District Medical Board.

A State Level Committee constituted by the Government under the Chairmanship of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations consisting of the members in the Medical Board constituted under the Chairmanship of DME and special invitee representing Pharmacy will take a final decision on the eligibility of a candidate for PwD quota as per the criteria and the suitability of the candidate to study a particular course applied by him/her. Necessary orders constituting State Level committee and State Medical Board will be issued by Government in due course and the same will be notified.

: Only those candidates who are having a minimum 40% of any disability and are found to be physically suitable by the Committee for the courses opted by the candidates will be chosen for a course as only the physically fit can undergo the rigors of a professional course. The recommendations of this State Level committee will be binding on the candidates. The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the merit in the Entrance Examination and physical suitability, and not on the basis of the degree of disability.

: The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will prepare and publish the list of candidates eligible under PwD quota based on the recommendations of the State Level Committee.

: "In case no qualified candidates are available under PD Category, the seats will go to General Merit." Seats will be earmarked for the PD Category as per the order of subjects shown in seat Distribution list published later.

7.2 Un-availed Reserved seats

If there are no candidates in the rank list of reserved category (7.1.1, 7.1.2 or 7.1.3) the same will be filled up by eligible candidates included in the Rank list of General Merit candidates.

7.3 Reservation of Seats for Economically Weaker Sections in general category: As per the G.O.(P)No.1/2020/P&ARD dated. 03.01.2020, G.O.(Ms)No.128/2020/H.Edn dated. 20.03.2020, Government have decided to implement 10% reservation for Economically Weaker Sections in General Category (EWS) to all Higher Educational Institutions other than minority Institutions, where the reservation to other backward classes are provided.

8. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION UNDER RESERVED CATEGORY

8.1 Service Quota

8.1.1 The candidate selected should have at least five years of service for superannuation after completion of the course. The selection under the service quota will be based on the qualified rank of the candidate in GPAT 2022. All applications claiming service quota shall be forwarded through the Heads of concerned Department (DME/DHS/DIMS/Drugs Controller).

8.1.2 The candidates admitted under service quota will have to serve the Government continuously for a period of not less than five years immediately after the completion of the course and shall not be permitted to avail Leave Without Allowance during that period for taking up employment elsewhere. In the event of any violation of these conditions, he/she will have to pay Rs.5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only) and stipend or salary drawn during the period of study as penalty to Government. Service candidates will have to execute a bond at the time of admission in this respect as given in Annexure IV.

8.1.3 Service candidates who are selected for M. Pharm course under Service

reservation quota who fail to join the course/discontinue the course after joining, other than on medical grounds will not be eligible for applying to the course under Service reservation quota for three consecutive years after the year of selection.

8.2 Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes Quota

The candidates who apply under this category should produce the Certificate from the Tahsildar of the Taluk concerned, that he/she belongs to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes (Ref : Annexure V and VI).

8.2.1 Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota

- 8.2.1(a) Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota should obtain the Caste/Community Certificate from a Revenue Officer not below the rank of a Tahsildar, in the prescribed format (Annexure VII). The following certificate should also be got recorded by the Revenue Official below the said certificates: "The Certificate is issued after observing the guidelines issued in Government Circular No. 18421/E2/SCSTDD dated 15-12-1987".
- 8.2.1(b) The applications for the reserved seats of Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes candidates which do not contain Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Certificates (Community Certificate) from the Tahsildar in the prescribed format will not be considered on any account against the seats reserved for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates (vide G.O. (MS)No.31/90/SCSTDD dated 25-05-1990). The community certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father or mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes. The Community Certificates obtained earlier for other purposes will not be accepted. The candidates who are reconverted to Hinduism from Christianity of Scheduled Caste origin should produce community certificate from the Tahsildar concerned along with a copy of Gazette Notification regarding re-conversion.
- 8.2.1(c) The claim for reservation under Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribes quota will also be subjected to verification and clearance by the Screening Committee constituted for the purpose by Government vide G.O. (MS) No.23/89/SCSTDD dated 22-05-1989 and as authorised by Section 6 of the Kerala (Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Regulation of issue of Community Certificates Act - 1996 (Act 11 of 1996).
- 8.2.1(d) The Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes claims in respect of those who have migrated from one State to another will be subjected to the provisions of GO (MS) No. 10/86/SCSTDD dated 12-02-1986. Only the children of those who had migrated to this State before the promulgation of the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1950 and the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order 1950, and who ordinarily reside in this State can claim Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes benefits from the State of Kerala. They must be able to prove this, if required.
- 8.2.1(e) Children of inter-caste marriage who claim reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota should produce necessary certificates to this effect from the Revenue Authorities (Annexure VIII). Their Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes claim will be subjected to verification and clearance by the Screening Committee constituted by the Government vide G.O. (MS) No. 23/89/SCSTDD dated, 22-05-1989. The application of

such candidates for the reserved seats of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes which do not contain Certificate from the Tahsildar concerned in the prescribed form provided in the body of the application will not be considered on any account (vide. G.O.(MS) No.31/90/SCSTDD dated 25-05-1990). The Community Certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father/mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes. There is no separate reservation quota for the children born of Inter caste married Couples of whom one is a Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes.

WARNING

Those who produce false certificates for claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota shall be liable for the penalties stipulated in Section 15 of the Act referred to in the Clause 8.2.1.(c). Candidates and their guardians who make such applications are warned that in addition to prosecution they will have to suffer the following consequences if the Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes certificate produced is found to be false and the candidate does not belong to any Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Communities under Section 16 of the Act:

"16- Benefits secured on the basis of false community certificates to be withdrawn"

1. Whoever not being a person belonging to any of the Scheduled Tribes secured admission in any education institutions against a seat reserved for such castes or tribes or secures any appointment in the Government, Government undertakings, Local Authority or in any other Company or Corporation owned or controlled by the Government or in any aided institutions against a post reserved for such castes or tribes or enjoys any other benefits intended exclusively for such castes or tribes by producing a false Community Certificate shall, on cancellation of the false Community Certificate, be removed by cancelling the irregular admission in the concerned educational institutions, or as the case may be removed from the said service forthwith and any benefit enjoyed by him as aforesaid shall be withdrawn forthwith.

2. Any amount paid to such person by Government or any other agency by way of scholarship, grant, allowance, stipend or any other financial benefit shall be recovered as if it is an arrear of public revenue due as land.

3. Any Degree, Diploma or any other educational qualifications acquired by such person after securing admission in any educational institution on the basis of a false community certificate shall also stand cancelled on cancellation of the community certificate obtained by him.

8.3 Claim for reservation under socially and economically backward classes (SEBC) Leaving the seats set apart for persons with disabilities, Vide G.O.(Ms)No.195/2021/H&FWD dated 30.10.2021, 27 % of the remaining seats under State quota shall be reserved for candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes. The percentage breakup of seats as per the SEBC reservation is as follows (Vide Letter No.S3/325/2021-Health, dated 12/11/2021).
